KCSPCA IN FINAL STAGES BEFORE PERMANENTLY OPENING NEW SHELTER

The Kings County Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (KCSPCA) is entering the final stages of preparations for the permanent Kings County SPCA Care Centre in Waterville, Nova Scotia. They are currently completing construction details at the shelter and getting equipment and supplies in place. They will be recruiting a Shelter Manager and volunteer staff shortly with a goal of opening the shelter within the next 4-6 weeks.

"Volunteers are working hard to get the shelter opened as soon as possible" stated Belle Darris, President, KCSPCA. "For many years our members have had this goal and it's wonderful to realize that we will finally succeed very soon. The shelter is built and now it is time to get the animals that are currently in foster care moved into the Care Centre and quickly placed in their new adoptive homes. We will continue our work in finding homes for abused and abandoned animals, protecting animals in need and raising public awareness about animal cruelty but with the new shelter our work will be more focused. We are excited about the new phase we are entering and are so appreciative of the support we have received from the business community and the general public. We will have a lot to celebrate at our grand opening scheduled for mid-summer."

Ms. Darris urges everyone to visit the KCSPCA website for updates on what's been happening over the past few months and see what plans they have for the future. A Junior SPCA group and a structured Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) Program are just two of the new projects in the planning stages.
